MORTON COUNTY COMMISSION REGULAR MEETING
December 10, 2015

The Morton County Commission Regular Meeting was called to order on December 10, 2015 at 5:30 PM by Chairman Strinden at the Morton County Courthouse, 210 Second Avenue NW, Mandan, North Dakota. Others present were Commissioners Zachmeier, Boehm, Leingang and Schulz, Auditor Rhone, States Attorney Kopy and Assistant States Attorney Grosinger.

Boehm moved and Leingang seconded to approve the agenda. All voting aye, motion carried.

Boehm moved and Leingang seconded to approve the minutes of the November 24, 2015 meeting. All voting aye, motion carried.

Schulz moved and Zachmeier seconded to approve bills and payroll. All voting aye, motion carried.

Schulz moved and Zachmeier seconded to approve the request for Morton County Development Funds for Tellmann's Market in New Salem in the amount of \$16,500. All voting aye, motion carried.

Zachmeier moved and Boehm seconded to authorize an increase in the contract with Attorney Greg Runge to \$525 per month in accordance with NDCC 25-03.1-13 for indigent civil commitments. All voting aye, motion carried.

Schulz moved and Leingang seconded to approve Homestead Credit Abatements 4780-4782. All voting aye, motion carried.

Boehm moved and Leingang seconded to appoint Tom Conlin to the Morton County School Reorganization Board to an unexpired term expiring June 30, 2018. All voting aye, motion carried.

The total of all county funds expended from November 25, 2015 through December 10, 2015, equals \$881,926.69. A detailed list of funds expended by check is available for public inspection anytime during regular business hours at the Morton County Auditor's Office.
